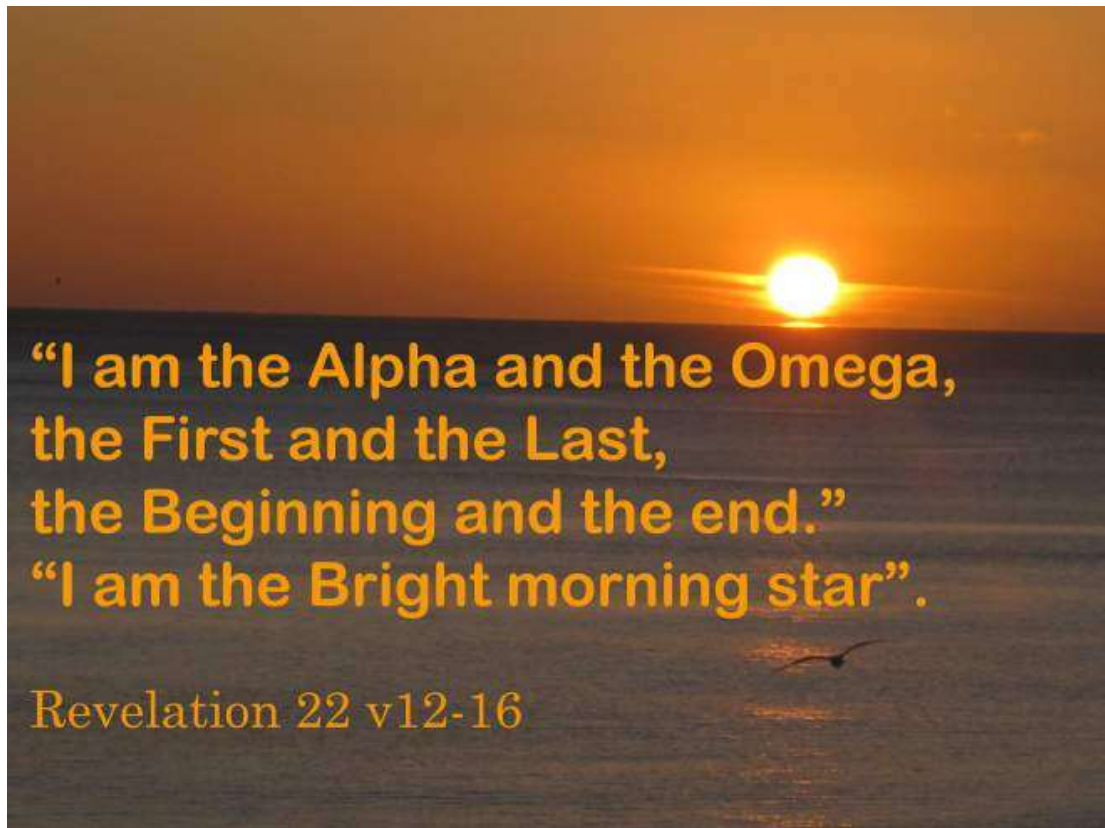

Meanwhile, don't forget to invite your friends to join us on our joint journey of discovery, as we walk with Jesus...together.

PARABLE OF THE SEAGULL



I looked out of my window and noticed a young seagull was standing on the netting of my garden pond – pecking away. I assumed he was after my goldfish for breakfast.

I ran out to chase the gull away, but instead of taking off, it just swiftly walked to the end of the garden and tried to hide behind a pot. Realising it was a young gull that couldn't yet fly, {and there did not seem to be a parent gull hanging around} I

left it alone and provisionally made some phone calls as to *what to do with a gull that wouldn't move from your garden.*

An hour and a half later it was still there, but had gone to the other side by some tiles. As I walked towards the gull, it started to waddle along the path. I gave chase ... it continued up the path and I was able to channel it through a small gap between the garage and house. Running through the house I caught up with the gull again as it walked out into the road. By this time I was beginning to feel guilty that it may get hit by a car, or cause a problem for traffic on the bend in the road it was now approaching. I continued to watch the young gull as it finally walked into a safe area away from the road. That incident reminded me of two things that God wants to remind us of as we walk by faith as His disciples.

*Just as I was watching the gull to know it was safe, God is watching over us every moment of each day. We may feel we're walking a lonely road at times, but God promises that He will be with us, and will never leave or forsake us.(Deut 31:6)

*Secondly –the seagull was at its stage in life when the parent gulls are teaching their young to fly. As followers of Jesus Christ – God wants to us to soar- (mount to great heights) in our faith, as we *trust in His goodness*. What crisis, challenge or decision faces you right now? As you pray for God's help and wisdom, may He encourage you in your life journey, so that you are sure of what you hope for, and certain of what you don't see. (Hebrews 11:1) That's faith!

When I asked them what they thought was the biggest challenge for Churches today in general – they both replied to be *relevant* ... without dilution, and making the bible more than a story.



I wanted to ask them a specific question about one of their ministry roles. I asked Hazel what she thought would keep Young people in Church. She told me that “They must feel they *belong*. To give them *a reason to come* and a *job to do* within the Church family. If Church is boring they won’t come, and they’ll go for the better offer.”

I asked Matt to share what he thought were some main characteristics required for a person in Church Leadership. He explained that in addition to the biblical qualities (Read 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:5-9) a leader needs to be a *servant*, feeling *inadequate in their own strength*, to ask for God’s *wisdom* in all situations and to be *sensitive* to other people, by putting yourself in their shoes.”

My final big question to them was “If you were invited to afternoon tea with the Prime Minister, what would you want to ask or share with him?” After a pause and a hint that they may not want to go to tea with “Mr C” – Hazel answered “In a *Christian* country, why is the Christian viewpoint put down? ...”

Matt and Hazel are a hard working couple, and totally committed to serving Jesus Christ with their gifts in Church mission and ministry. I hope that in the near future they will be able to have a relaxing and stress free break, maybe in one of their favourite places which includes... Scotland, Greece or Iceland.(while listening to *These are the days of Elijah* and *How great Thou art* through their headphones)

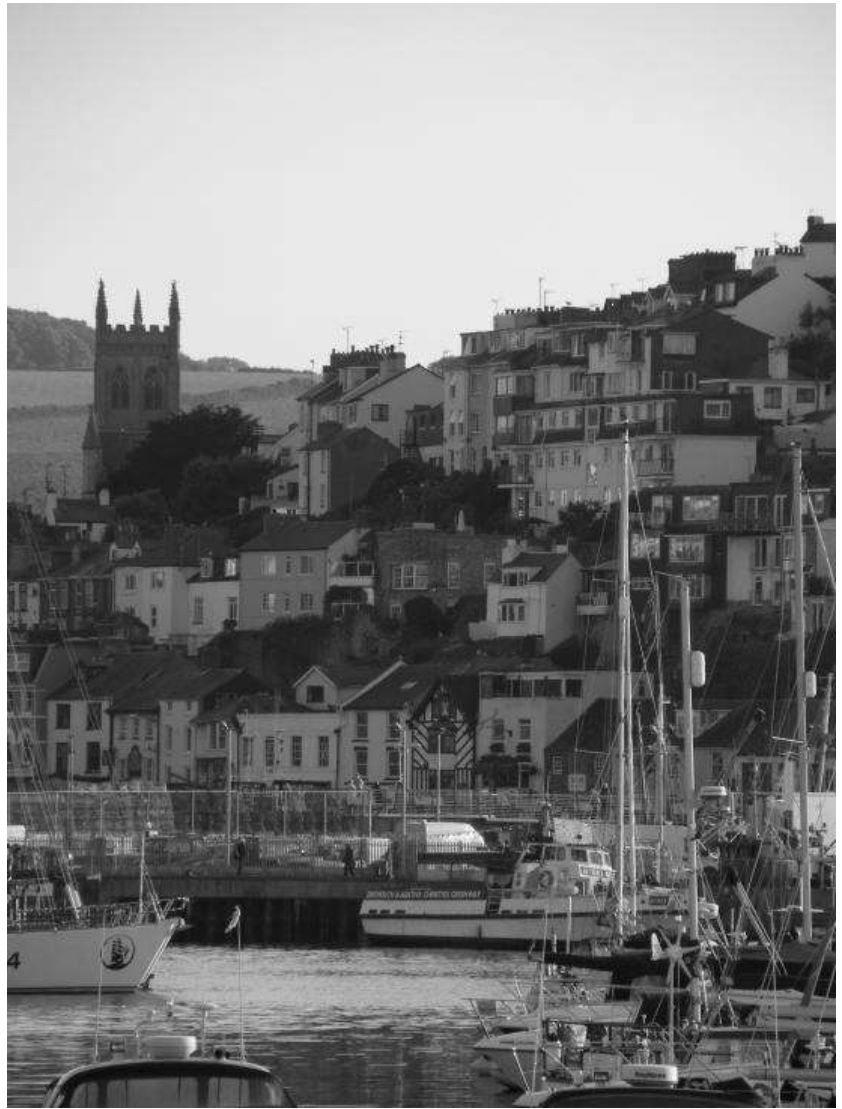

Jutt has had a few problems as her stomach has not liked some of the new foods!

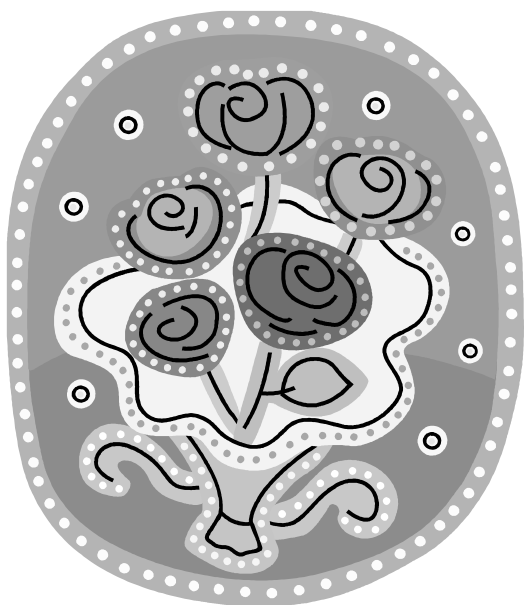

It has been a really manic summer on the youth work front. With so much going on, I have been involved with Elevate. Linx's non-residential summer camp, which saw 79 young people from around the bay join together for a week of fun and activities.



It was great to build relationships with the young people who came along, and hopefully there is the opportunity to build on them further in the coming months as we begin to get back into our regular activities. On top of that we ran a football academy for primary school aged children. We had 16 kids attend during the week, which consisted of skill sessions and matches,



finishing off the week with a world cup tournament.

Each day there was a talk, introducing the kids to the Christian message, and it was great to see a number of them attend Street Church on the following Sunday, in the future it is something I would like to turn into a regular event, as sport is such a good way to reach young people for Jesus.



I also spoke at the linx camp this summer, we took 30 young people to Gloucester for the week, and it was a real privilege to see how God moved in their lives, many really met with God, some experienced the Holy Spirit for the first time, and the whole week had a really positive impact.

We are almost back to term time again and have some exciting things coming up. We

are starting a second discipleship group for young people, we are running a new course called 'storylines' on a Sunday morning, which gives young people an overview of the whole bible from Genesis to Revelation, and shows how God's big story fits together and what part they have to play in it. As well as all of our regular

activities such as the Island Club, N:Gage, RE:Fuel, Thrive, Surge, Boys' and Girls' brigade. I am genuinely excited about how God is going to move over the course of the coming year, I believe that he is really going to impact the lives of young people in Brixham over the next 12 months, as always we need more helpers! The harvest is plentiful but the labourers are few.

With that in mind one thing that God has impressed upon my heart this Summer is that God can use anyone in his service and for his Glory. 1 Corinthians 1:27 says "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong."
