Sow righteousness for yourselves, reap the fruit of unfailing love, and break up your unploughed ground; for it is time to seek the Lord until He comes and showers His righteousness on you.

(Hosea chapter 10 verse 12)

Every farmer has areas that are undeveloped. So too every follower of Jesus has areas of their lives that are unproductive, unfruitful and unhelpful in our walk with the Lord. Again, this has been a time when gently, and with some necessary pain, the Lord has been revealing areas where He invites me to love Him and others more deeply.

for it is time to seek the Lord, until he comes and showers His righteousness on you.

Sabbatical gave me that time to notice what the Lord is doing, how His Spirit is at work in the church and in our lives and that if we let Him, He will shower us even more with His blessings and transforming Spirit.

So I return humbled, changed, recharged and restored for the journey ahead.
